What you told us is desirable about Ballygowan...



- Respondents identified the retail heart of the village with a wide selection of shops owned by local people providing high quality local produce as highly desirable. The shops provide a wide range of produce while still remaining local and in walkable distance for a majority of the residents
- Respondents appreciated the connectivity links from the village to surrounding areas, which allows rapid commutes to Belfast City Centre for work or leisure. These transport links also allow residents to travel to Downpatrick, Comber or Newtownards with ease. Additionally, links to Strangford Lough and the surrounding countryside were mentioned.
- The **community spirit** is very prevalent in the village with people identifying the friendly and welcoming nature of locals to everybody and anybody who uses the village. The village hall was also noted for providing community events throughout the year for all

What you think are the Unique Selling Points for Ballygowan...

- Respondents stated that the most unique selling point of Ballygowan is the **rural** location combined with strong connectivity and transport links to the surrounding areas. The village as such serves as a quiet, peaceful residential area but remains close to larger settlements including Belfast, Downpatrick, Comber and Newtownards.
- 2 The **community** in the village was identified as a unique selling point, with Ballygowan described as friendly and welcoming. Respondents highlighted that many families have lived in the area for several generations, contributing to the close-knit community spirit.

104 respondents shared their positive feelings about the Village, some of the comments received:

What you told us is undesirable about Ballygowan...

• The most undesirable aspect of Ballygowan was identified as traffic and parking conditions. Lack of suitable parking in the village centre and for Park & Ride along with consistent speeding by by-passers was identified as undesirable. This also extends to the road network with potholes and resurfacing needs being highly mentioned.

"It's a great wee place"

"I wouldn't think of living anywhere else"

"Love living here and raising my young family"

"Living there for 9 years and love the community spirit, fundraising within the village and the rural life"

"The people are lovely"

120 respondents shared their **negative** feelings about the Village, some of the comments received:

"Needs modernising"

"Lacks a 'heart', suffers from unsightly area adjacent to pharmacy."

"It could be a lovely village if it was tidied up" "Nothing to do for children within the village"

"It is not invested in and never seems to get" a decent budget from the council or local government. It seems like it's forgotten about" The lack of a wider variety of facilities was identified as undesirable. Respondents state that there is a need for more amenities in the area aimed at occupying children and young people, which may help to address the concerns relating to antisocial behaviour.

• **Dereliction** ranked highly undesirable with the main emphasis on the area beside the pharmacy due to the location being in the village centre and causing an eyesore for any visitors to the village. In terms of the visual appeal of the area, many residents also raised their concerns over the presence of flags.

"I feel there could be improvements as quite" often people who drive through the village do so at speed and without care for the area"

 Concerns were also raised over the lack of maintenance including weeds, litter and dog fouling. Grass cutting in green spaces was also mentioned with emphasis on children's play parks needing attended to.




