


Your Vision for Lisbane & Lisbarnett

Since May 2024 Ards and North Down Borough Council have been undertaking a comprehensive engagement process to develop a new Lisbane & Lisbarnett Village Plan



Uhat you told us is desirable about Lisbane & Lisbarnett...

- The Village, despite being small in size, with its current facilities and retail options, of the garage, pub, and café, local amenities and GP service are all highly desirable.
- **Community** is also highly recognised by its community spirit and friendly people.
- The connectivity of the area given its proximity to Belfast, Comber and Newtownards.
- The village with its floral displays, being quiet, small in size and within a beautiful setting were also detailed.


What you think are the Unique Selling Points for Lisbane & Lisbarnett...

- 1 The **Trade and Commerce** present within the village, such as the Old Post Office and The Poachers Pocket are highly desirable.
- It's Connectivity, due to its location, to surrounding cities and towns such as Belfast, Newtownards, Comber, Killinchy and Downpatrick.
- 3 The Facilities, which are every-day and local amenities.

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How you feel about Lisbane & Lisbarnett...

29 respondents shared their **positive** feelings

about the Village, some of the comments received:

- "Good location and good facilities"
- "Pleasant small village"
- *"I feel the village is at a good stage at the moment"*
- "I like my village"
- *"I like the village it's safe, pretty and close to the sea as well as Belfast and Comber"*
- "I'm proud to call it home"

12 respondents shared their **negative** feelings about the Village, some of the comments received:

- "Could do with additional resources"
- "In need of community facilities"
- "Need more public transport facilities / stops"



What you told us is undesirable about Lisbane & Lisbarnett...

- The undesirables detailed from respondents related to traffic, primarily the speed at which it travels the central main road. Lack of traffic calming measures and safe road crossings for children has resulted in safety concerns.
- The lack of footpaths in areas has been raised, along with road maintenance issues such as potholes, and bus stop location which also has no bus shelter.
- There is a feel of overdevelopment in the village with the new housing, discontent with public transport, flags being erected at certain times of the year given it's a mixed community and maintenance concerns regarding grass cutting and litter.

"Needs enhancing of environment"

"May need some small improvements"

"The vehicles travelling through the village greatly in excess of the speed limit with no regard to the safety of the residents." It lacks a central area, community hub, benches, activities for children, and the play park is inaccessible and needs refurbished. A lack of open green space, a 'tired and dated' community centre and parking were also detailed.


